Assignment # 3 - *Ethan Frome*

While reading *Frome*, please record ten journal entries of at least ½ page each (handwritten). Please use the following format when writing entries:

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What should you put in the journal entries? I want your *thoughts* and *reflections*, NOT a plot summary. I want you to *respond* to the characters, their actions and decisions, archaic customs, unfamiliar vocabulary terms, etc. If you need help, use the following questions, but don't feel like you are "bound" to them.

1. What do you like? Dislike? Find comfortable? Find irritating? Why?
2. Comment on the characters. Describe them in physical, mental, and emotional terms. Do any of the characters seem to change?
3. Describe the relationship between the characters. Explain what the characters seem to value (what is important).
4. Describe the setting. How is it important to the novel?
5. Explain and describe what unanswered questions you have thus far.
6. Describe the author's attitude toward life. Is he / she optimistic or pessimistic? Explain.
7. Discuss any prevalent literary devices: tone, symbolism, irony, diction,

The books need to be read in their entirety and the assignments completed by Wednesday, August 17. In addition, we will spend about two days discussing each novel before being tested on the material.
